WELLNESS PROGRAM

Thanks to PetSmart Charities' generous grant, our community wellness program has had a significant impact since its launch last year, helping 35,000 vulnerable pets through its various support initiatives. Staffed by skilled student veterinarians from the Ontario Veterinary College and overseen by our dedicated Medical Director, Dr. Farr, we have provided crucial services like exams, vaccinations, flea prevention, and deworming to community pets through 30 annual clinics.

The Companion Animal Hospital at HBSPCA offers a wide range of services, from budget-friendly spay/neuter procedures to intricate, life-saving surgeries seldom performed in shelter settings. Our devoted team of volunteers and staff at the animal hospital is always ready to handle any situation, no matter how challenging or frightened the animals may be.

The patient could be a puppy hit by a car and in need of urgent care for a fractured leg, a malnourished cat rescued from a hoarding situation, or a dog needing cancer treatment. Plus, through our veterinary medicine program, we serve as a teaching hospital to train the next generation of shelter veterinarians.

We invest up to \$14,000 annually for animals surrendered, rescued and treated through our companion animal hospital.

Training Resources for Owned Pets

Behaviour challenges are common reasons we see pets relinquished to shelters. But the right support and training resources can make a world of difference! Our Behaviour & Training program provides pet training classes led by our partners, K9 Principles, to set animals and their people up for success.

Watching Peanut Come Out of His Shell

When Peanut first arrived at our shelter as a rescue, he was incredibly shy and fearful. Our staff began working with him and, over time, saw his behaviour change dramatically. Enrolling him in our Behaviour Training program gave him a calm, controlled environment in which to blossom. A regular regimen of positive reinforcement and enrichment helped this previously timid, growling boy become a comfortable, affectionate companion. After 158 days in our care, Peanut got the second chance he deserved when he was adopted into wonderful home.

Various fostering opportunities, such as Emergency, End-of-Life, Short-term, and Long-term placements, are available. Our dedicated foster volunteers play a crucial role in our community as they open their homes to these animals, making a life-saving impact by freeing up space in our shelters and enabling us to assist more pets in need.

The Power of Foster LOVE

Sunshine was a thin stray and needed to be placed in a foster home to gain weight and wait for her spaying surgery. The commitment shown by her foster mother was truly remarkable! She provided Sunshine with a tranquil space in her house where she could relax and gradually develop trust in humans. Sunshine is well and shining in her new forever home, thanks to her foster family's love, patience, and passion.

A Foster Milestone!

The dedication of our foster volunteers is unbelievable. This year, volunteer Anne reached an incredible milestone: fostering over 250 pets for Hamilton/Burlington SPCA!

Community Cat PROGRAM

We believe free-roaming cats need love too. Our Community Cat Program - Operation Cat Snip, supports free-roaming outdoor cats with no verifiable signs of ownership.

To accomplish this mission, we have established partnerships with over 36 community groups, rescues, and charitable organizations within the city.

Before returning these community cats to their outdoor habitats, we ensure they receive essential medical attention. This includes spay/neuter procedures, thorough veterinary examinations, and necessary vaccinations. By doing so, we strive to promote the health and well-being of these cats while also controlling the population of free-roaming felines.




